Sketchbook, at least 8 1/2" x 11", spiral-bound is best

"H" and "B" Pencils, I suggest 4H, 2H, 2B, and 4B

Gray Kneaded Eraser, Pink Pearl Eraser, and any others you use

Ruler

Craft Knife or Utility Knife

Pad of Tracing Paper

Box of, or 3 or 4, Gray Markers in Different Values

Paint, Any Medium: Black, White, a warm and a cool of Reds (like Alizarin and Cadmium), Yellows (like Lemon and Cadmium or Indian), Blues (like Cobalt and Ultramarine), Earth Colors like Raw and Burnt Sienna, and Burnt Umber

Brushes you normally use – rounds, flats, filberts, brights, or any others you have

Other equipment needed for your medium, like rags, paper towels, water bins, mineral spirits, etc. Please call me at 565-2736 if you are unsure or have any questions.

Supports:

Watercolor paper (140 lb. cold or hot press) for watercolors or acrylics

Acrylic Gesso and Acrylic Medium for acrylics on paper, whatever paper you use

Oil-Primed Linen or Primed Cotton Canvas for oils (Fredrix, Utrecht, or Gamblin) or canvas panels
